The picture does not have to be fancy. Just draw a quick sketch with your pencil and then color it in with your crayons.

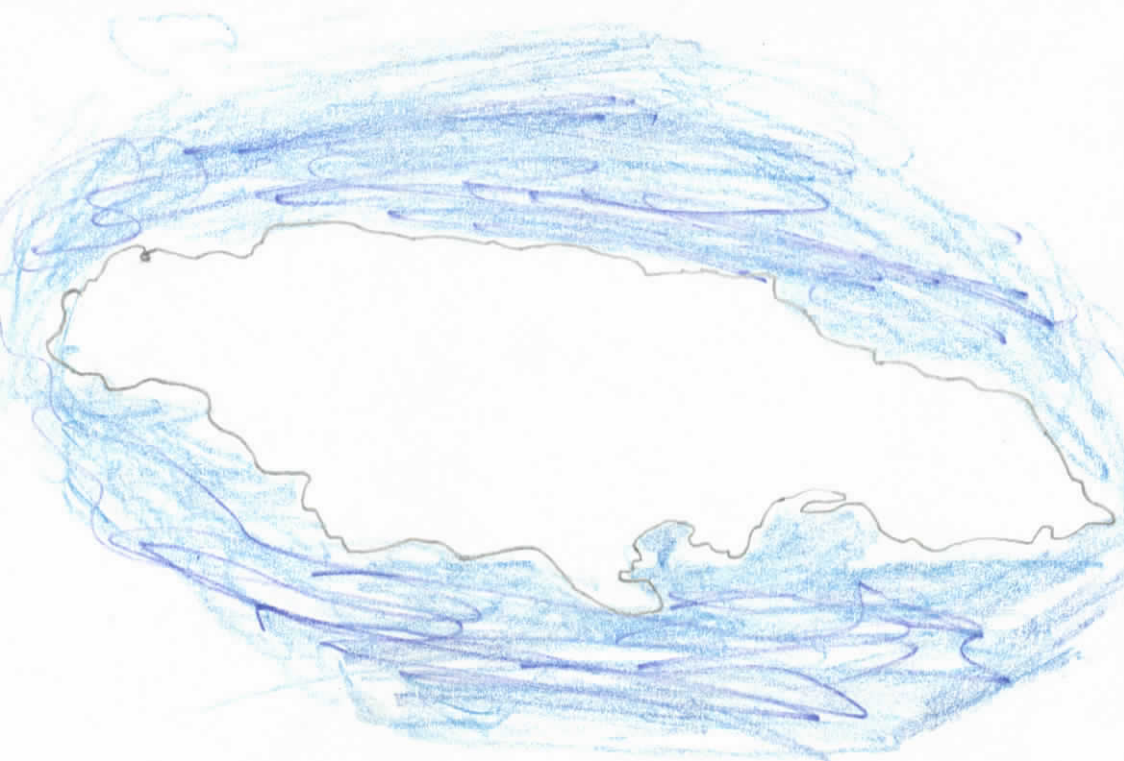

Draw a picture of some visitors who have come to Jamaica from far away.

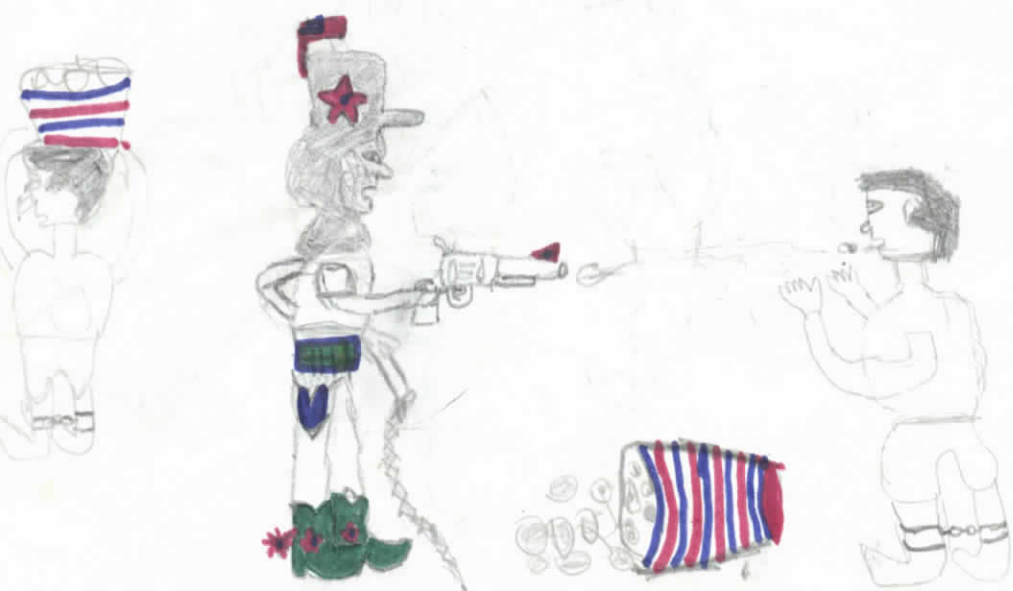

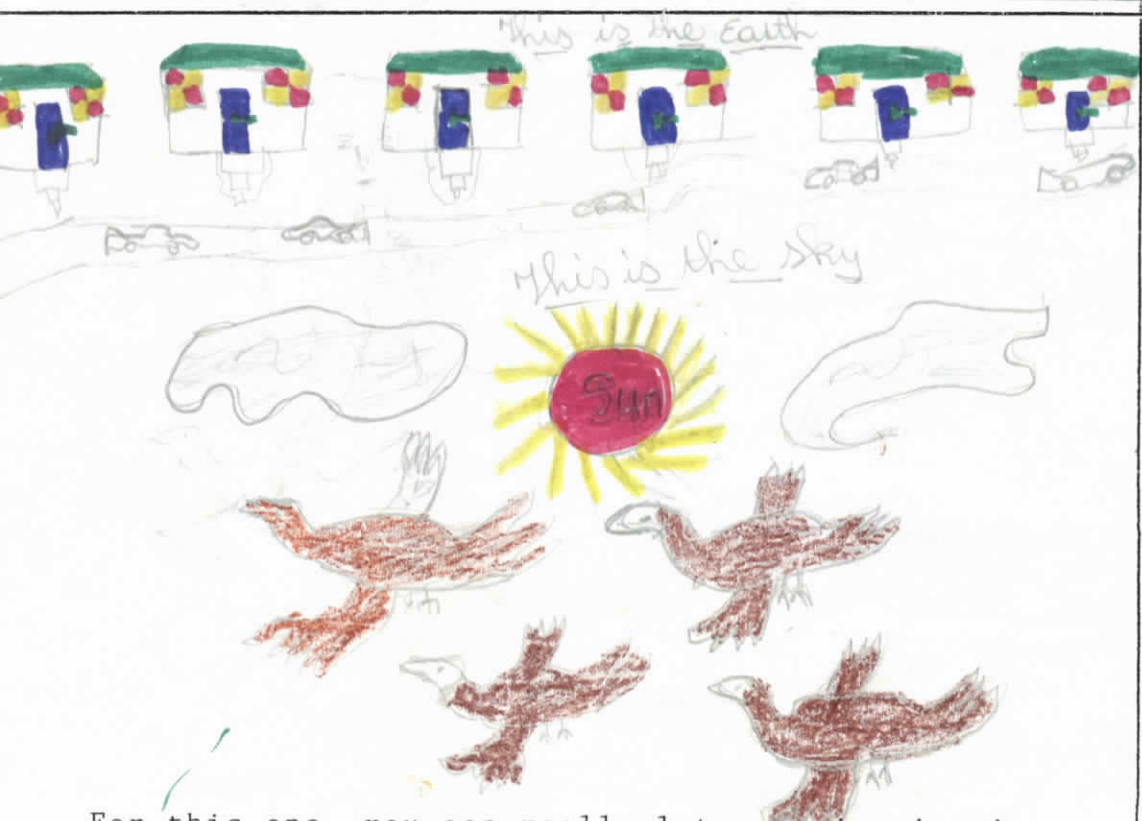
Draw a map that shows Jamaica. It can be any kind of map as long as it includes Jamaica.
